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General Dance Rules

1. Competition procedure:

- At the beginning of each event, a competition time schedule will be made available to the competitor.
- Competitors must report to the floor coordinator 15 minutes prior to their competition.
- A Floor Coordinator will escort competitors to their positions on the dance floor.
- Competitors who are not available when their name is called are liable to be scratched.
- In all circumstances the Contest Coordinators' decisions will be final.
- Any formal complains must be directed to the Contest Coordinator.

2. Competitors Check-In

3. Costumes

- Boots are required in all dances.
- A Judge will take into consideration the costume of the competitor and determine the country look and dance character suitability and decency of the costume and will reflect their opinion in their scoring ballot.
- Male star dancers are NOT required to wear a hat in their solo medley. Boots MUST be worn.

4. Eligibility and Eligibility Period:

- The period of eligibility to accumulate your graduation points is the current dance year plus the two (2) previous dance years. You may remain in your current division until after the Worlds Championships.
- Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member BEFORE they can compete.
- All Social dancers will be given a free registration number. One month before they are due to move up to the Newcomer Division, they MUST inform the Registration Desk and pay their membership fee BEFORE they can register to dance in the Newcomer division at any event.
- If a competitor does not compete in any WCDF competition for a continuous 2 dancing year period, they may re-enter at a lower lever, excluding the Newcomer division. You may not compete in the Newcomer division if you have competed at a higher level at any time.
- A competitor may change to a lower skill level only when:
 - a. During the eligibility period the competitor did not compete.
 - b. A junior competitor changes to a higher age division.
- Competitors can only dance in ONE (1) skill division at any one event.
- Competitors can only dance in ONE (1) age division at any one event.
- If there are 2 or less dancers in any division at worlds, the dancers will not be forced to graduate to the higher division..
- Graduation shall take place the day after the World Championships ends or the First of January, whichever comes last.
- The Newcomer competitor may self graduate to the Novice or Intermediate division at any time.
- The Novice competitor may self graduate to the Intermediate division at any time.
- The Intermediate competitor CANNOT self graduate to the Advanced division.
- The Intermediate competitor will NOT earn points in the Showcase division.

- If the majority of a dancers dances (Novice to Advanced) are resulting in 'D' grading on the judges ballot sheets, they can choose to return to a lower division.
- All Social competitors should have competed in at least one (1) International event.

5. Floorcraft

- All competitors should be respectful to other competitors and not interfere with or disrupt them.
- All competitors should be able to use floorcraft to enhance their dance.
- For Line Dance divisions, once the Floor Coordinator has spaced the competitor on the floor, their dance space is determined.
- Once the dance has begun the competitor should remain within the flow of the step description.
- When doing variations you must not intrude on the dance space of other competitors.

6. Gender Requirements

- Line Dance competitors will compete male against male and female against female.
- Choreography and Renegade division competitors are of mixed gender.
- A Troupe or Team may have any combination of male and female competitors, except Couples teams who must have male/female partnerships or one partner must assume the role of the male, dressing accordingly, appearing as one male and one female.

7. Graduation Criteria

- Graduation shall take place the day after the World Championships ends or the First of January, whichever comes last..
- The graduation letter will show if the dancer MUST graduate or MAY (has the option to) graduate.
- After Worlds 2009, a letter will be sent to each competitor stating into which division they are allowed to compete using the 2006/7 ranking system.
- After each World Championships, an announcement is to be placed on the WCDF website to congratulate each individual dancer who have graduated to a higher division.
- When the 'Confirmation of Registration' letter is sent to the dancer, it will advise them of any graduation to a higher division. It will also state if they may continue to dance in the lower division until after the next World Championships.
- The Social Division graduation criteria will be governed by the Event Director who will advise the dancer of their criteria.
- If the majority of a competitor's dances (Novice to Advanced) are resulting in 'D' grading on the judges' ballot sheets, they can choose to return to a lower division.

10. Music

- The only format music that will be accepted is on CD, which must be clearly marked on both the label and the cover.
- Self selected music along with a resume of the medley, must be given to the DJ at least 4 hours before the competition begins (at registration at the World Championships) or risk being scratched. This applies to all Solo Medleys and all Teams.
- The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time requirements is you will be placed last.
- Competitors self selected music must use Country music for all parts of their performance, except:-
- Solo Medley in which you can use a combined total of 50% non-country music.
- Teams in which you can use a combined total of 50% non-country music.
- Non-Country Choreography divisions.
- Team Cabaret which may use any music of their choice.
- The Line Dance music preview is 30 seconds per dance.

Determining the “country-ness” of a song.

- A song is deemed to be Country music if it is approved in advance by the Music Selection Board or:
- It has appeared at anytime on any nationally syndicated Country music charts.
- If it is performed by a country music group from any country. (Verification may be required)
- The artist must be classified as a country artist. If a non country artist sings a country song it is not classified as country.
- If it is a non country song performed by a recognized country artist.
- Only radio and album edits are allowed, no special remixes!
- If in any doubt or you have any questions about country music then please contact: The WorldCDF Music Selection Board. Alex Boone and the Music Board will make the final decision on what is country music. Their decision will be final.

Music Preview:

- The Line Dance music preview is to be reduced to 30 seconds per dance.
- The music preview in pro-am will be reduced to a maximum of 30 seconds x 3 times per dance, at the event directors’ discretion.

11. Offered and Qualified Divisions

- **Social division is for competitors who have never competed at a competitive event.**
- **Classic and Showcase Divisions:**
 - Classic Newcomer
 - Classic Novice
 - Classic Intermediate
 - Showcase Intermediate
 - Classic Advanced
 - Showcase Advanced

- **Couples Divisions:**
 - Combined - Novice, Intermediate and Advanced skill levels combined. (Excludes-Newcomers)
 - Champions
 - Royal
 - Sovereign

- **Competitors qualify from advanced and showcase divisions only to the following:**
 - Rising Stars Division 14 – 17
 - Megastars Division 18+
 - Jewel Division 30+
 - Regal Divisions 40+

- **Troupes and Teams:**
 - Small Troupe (2, 3 or 4 members) All Ages.
 - Large Troupe (5, 6 or 7 members) All Ages.
 - Team (8 or more members) All Ages.
 - Social Teams (4 members or more) All Ages.
 - Open All Ages
 - Junior All members under 18
 - Diamond All members at least 40

Social

1. Age requirements

- a. Your age is the age you will be on the last day of that calendar year.
- b. Age categories:
 - i. Junior 0-9
 - ii. Youth 10-13
 - iii. Teens 14-17
 - iv. Adult 18+
 - v. Adult Senior 40+

2. Overall requirements

- a. For overall qualification competitors have to compete in all 3 dances, chosen by the Event Director.

3. Entry regulations

- a. This division is for beginner line dancers who have never competed in a Linedance competition.
- b. Male and Female Dancers will not compete against each other (Female against Female and Male against Male).
- c. WCDF Membership is not compulsory.
- d. All Social dancers will be given a FREE registration number. One month before they are due to move up to the Newcomer Division, they MUST inform the Registration Desk and pay their membership fee BEFORE they can register to dance in the Newcomer division at any event.

2. Graduation criteria

- a. The graduation criteria will be governed by the Event Director who will advise the dancers of their criteria.

3. World Champions requirements

- a. This division does not qualify for the World Championships. This division will not offer a 'World Champion Title' only 'Social Division Champion'.
- b. All Social competitors should have competed in at least one (1) International event.

4. Basic Dance rules

- a. Social dancers must dance only full basic vanilla patterns with no variations.

5. Movement limitations

- a. No introduction steps are allowed.

6. Music

- a. Original music will be used.
- b. Dance music length: 2 minutes
- c. Each dance will be counted in.

7. Costumes

- a. No special costume requirements.
- b. Safe footwear required.

Newcomer

1. Age requirements

a. Your age is the age you will be on the last day of that calendar year.

b. Age categories:

- i. Jr. Primary 0-9
- ii. Jr. Youth 10-13
- iii. Jr. Teen 14-17
- iv. Open 18+
- v. Crystal 30+
- vi. Diamond 40+
- vii. Silver 50+
- viii. Gold 60+

2. Overall requirements

a. For overall qualification competitors have to compete in at least **5** of the **6** dances.

3. Entry regulations

a. Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member before they compete.

b. This division is for competitors who graduate from social division and for anyone who has just started to compete.

4. Graduation criteria

a. Line dance competitors who dance at an International Event move to the Novice Division on the following graduated scale which depends on the total number of overall competitors.

b. After one win for overall at an International event with three or more competitors or one win for overall at the World Championships, you have to graduate to Novice.

c. Newcomer competitors may self graduate at any time.

d. Graduation shall take place the day after the World Championships ends.

5. World Championships requirements

a. All competitors should have competed in at least 3 International events in line, one of which must be for overall.

6. Basic Dance rules

a. Newcomers must dance only full basics. No variations are allowed.

7. Movement limitations

- a. A stationary dancing introduction is allowed within the radius of a single step during the music prior to the start of the dance, as long as no full turn is performed.

8. Music

- a. Music may be changed from the original, but will be the same rhythm.
- b. Dance music length: 2 minutes.
- c. Each dance will be counted in.

9. Costumes

- a. Newcomer Competitors must wear:
 - i. Costumes should be appropriate to the dance character.
 - ii. Cowboy boots or lace-up Roper style boots..
 - iii. Costume must be country in appearance, except in Novelty and Funky. It could help to have a yoke in the front or back, but is not necessary.
 - iv. Cowboy Hats for men, except in Funky and Novelty dances.
 - v. Hose and dance pants of any color for ladies, junior youth and above, if they are exposed.
 - vi. Advertisements on competition clothes are not allowed.
 - vii. Sparkly attachments or materials are not allowed, although shiny material is allowed.
 - viii. Props are not allowed such as face masks and weapons of any kind. Limited theatrical makeup will be allowed

2. Overall requirements

a. For overall qualification competitors have to compete in at least **5** of the **6** dances.

3. Entry regulations

a. Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member before they compete.

b. This division is for competitors who graduate from the Newcomer division and for dance teachers.

4. Graduation criteria

a. Line dance competitors who dance at an International Event move to Intermediate division on the following graduated scale which depends on the total number of overall competitors.

b. After two wins at an International event with three or more competitors or one win for overall at the World Championships, you have to graduate to Intermediate.

c. Novice competitors may self graduate at any time.

d. If the majority of a competitors dances are resulting in 'D' grading on the judges ballot sheets, they can choose to return to a lower division.

e. Graduation shall take place the day after the World Championships ends.

5. World Championships requirements

a. All competitors should have competed in at least 3 International events in line, one of which must be for overall.

6. Basic Dance rules

a. Competitors have to start with a full basic pattern.

b. Each rendition has to start with two measures of basic (without variation from the step description). Two measures of music is 8 counts of 4/4 time music or 6 counts of ¾ time music.

- c. Variations must follow the flow of the dance and are limited to two measures of music (8 counts in 4/4 and 6 counts in 3/4 music), or less.
- d. Throughout the dance, each variation must be followed by two measures of basic pattern..
- e. If an a-b-c dance is used, a full vanilla pattern must be danced the first time the a, b or c section is being danced.
- f. Each time an a, b or c section is repeated, you must dance the first 8 counts in vanilla pattern.

7. Movement limitations

- a. A stationary dancing introduction is allowed within the radius of a single step during the music, prior to the start of the dance.
- b. Moves that include aeriels, acrobatics, drops (any type), rides, drags, slides, slashes, sitting, lying or bridging on the floor are not allowed.
- c. Stationary balanced moves that rotate are not allowed.
- d. Platform turns or fans on an unbent knee are permitted only if both feet maintain floor contact.
- e. Dance movements that rotate because of a leg kick or swing are permitted to turn only up to 360 degrees.
- f. Splits and sits to recover from splits are not allowed.

8. Music

- a. Music may be changed from the original, but will be the same rhythm.
- b. Dance music length: 2 minutes.
- c. Each dance will be counted in.

b. After three wins at an International event with three competitors or more or one win for overall at the World Championships you have to graduate to Advanced.

c. Intermediate dancers may NOT self graduate into Advanced.

d. If the majority of a dancers dances are resulting in 'D' grading on the judges ballot sheets, they can choose to return to a lower division.

e. Graduation shall take place the day after the World Championships ends.

5. World Championships requirements

a. All competitors should have competed in at least 3 International events in line, one of which must be for overall.

6. Basic Dance rules

a. Competitors have to start with a full basic.

b. Each rendition has to start with two measures of basic (without variation from the step description). Two measures of music is 8 counts of 4/4 time music or 6 counts of 3/4 time music.

- c. Variations must follow the flow of the dance and are limited to two measures of music (8 counts in 4/4 and 6 counts in 3/4 music), or less.
- d. Throughout the dance, each variation must be followed by two measures of basic.

- e. Dance movements that rotate because of a leg kick or swing are permitted to turn up to 360degrees.

1 Age requirements

- a. Your age is the age you will be on the last day of that calendar year.
- b. Age categories:
 - i. Jr. Primary 0-9
 - ii. Jr. Youth 10-13
 - iii. Jr. Teen 14-17
 - iv. Open 18+
 - v. Crystal 30+
 - vi. Diamond 40+
 - vii. Silver 50+
 - viii. Gold 60+

2 Overall requirements

- a. For overall qualification competitors have to compete in at least 5 of the 6 dances.

3. Entry regulations

- a. Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member before they compete.
- e. This division is for competitors who graduate from the Intermediate division only.

4. Graduation criteria

- a. Teen division can graduate to Rising Star.
- b. Open Division can graduate to Megastar.
- c. Crystal Division can graduate to Jewel
- d. Diamond/Silver/Gold Division can graduate to Regal.
- e. After three wins at an International event with three or more competitors or one win for overall at the World Championships in Classic Line Dance Overall AND Showcase Overall, you can graduate to Rising Star, Megastar, Jewel or Regal.
- f. Advanced Dancers will accumulate Points at events where there are only 1 or 2 competitors.
 - i. 1 competitor earns $\frac{1}{4}$ point
 - ii. 2 competitors earn $\frac{1}{2}$ point
 - iii. 3 or more competitors earn 1 full point.
Therefore if a dancer wins 2 events where there are only 2 competitors they will earn 1 full point.
- g. All competitors must win at least 1 Overall where there are 3 or more competitors in Classic Line and in Showcase.
- h. Points will only be earned or determined by the number of competitors dancing for overall.
- i. If there are competitors dancing less than 5 dances, they will not be counted for the awarding of points.
- j. If the majority of a dancer's dances are resulting in 'D' grading on the judges ballot sheets, they can choose to return to a lower division.
- k. No new stars will be announced until they have been confirmed, by checking their graduation points are correct. Only when the points are verified will the graduation take place.
- l. The dancer must first contact the secretary for confirmation, supplying the points and events where they believe they have qualified, and prior to competing at the event where they can gain their final point. If this is not done, no graduation will take place.

5. World Championships requirements

- a. All competitors should have competed in at least 3 International Events in Line with at least 1 competition for overall.

6. Basic Dance rules

- a. Competitors have to start with a full basic.
- b. Each rendition has to start with two measures of basic (without variation from the step description). Two measures of music is 8 counts of 4/4 time music or 6 counts of 3/4 time music.
- c. Variations must follow the flow of the dance and are limited to two measures of music or less.
- d. Throughout the dance, each variation must be followed by two measures of basic.
- e. In an ABC or Tag dance, each section of the dance; A, B, or C, or the Tag must begin with a full basic before any variation may be performed.

7. Movement limitations

- a. A stationary dancing introduction is allowed within the radius of a single step during the music prior to the start of the dance.
- b. Moves that include aeriels, acrobatics, drops (any type), rides, drags, slides, slashes, sitting, lying or bridging on the floor are not allowed.
- c. Platform turns or fans on an unbent knee are permitted only if both feet maintain floor contact.
- d. Dance movements that rotate because of a leg kick or swing are permitted to turn up to 360 degrees.
- e. Splits and sits to recover from splits are not allowed.
- f. Jetés without rotation are allowed.

8. Music

- a. Music may be changed from the original, but will be the same rhythm.
- b. Dance music length: 2 minutes
- c. Each dance will be counted in.

9. Costumes

- a. Advanced competitors must wear:
 - i. Costumes should be appropriate to the dance character.
 - ii. Cowboy boots or lace-up Roper style boots.
 - iii. Costume must be country in appearance, except in Novelty and Funky. It could help to have a yoke in the front or back, but is not necessary.
 - iv. Cowboy Hats for men except in Funky and Novelty dances.
 - v. Hose and dance pants of any color for ladies, junior youth and above, if they are exposed.
 - vi. Advertisements on competition clothes are not allowed.
 - vii. Glitter and sparkly attachments or materials are allowed.
 - viii. Props are not allowed such as face masks and weapons of any kind. Limited theatrical makeup will be allowed.

Rising Star / Megastar / Jewel / Regal

1. Age Requirements

A. Your age is the age you will be on the last day of that calendar year

B. Age Categories:

- i. Rising Star 14 -17
- ii. Megastar 18+
- iii. Jewel 30-39
- iv. Regal 40+

2. Overall Requirements

A. Megastars, Rising Stars, Jewel & Regal Overall Championship entries must compete in Dance A (a 'smooth, rise & fall' dance like Waltz or Nightclub), Dance B (a 'rhythm' dance like East Coast or Polka and Cha, Cha) and a Solo Medley.

3. Entry Regulations

A. Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member before they compete.

B. These divisions are for competitors who graduate from the Advanced Classic Line & Showcase division.

4. Graduation Criteria

A. All New star dancers must complete 1 full program within 1 year of graduating to that division to earn their status as a star dancer.

B. For Rising Stars: In the year when they reach the age of 18 years, they will be credited with 3 points in Advanced Showcase which will add to their qualifying points for Megastars.

C. No new stars will be announced until they have been confirmed, by checking their graduation points are correct. Only when the points are verified will the graduation take place.

D. The dancer must first contact the secretary for confirmation, supplying the points and events where they believe they have qualified, prior to competing at the event where they can gain their final point. If this is not done, no graduation will take place.

5. World Championships requirements

A. All competitors must have competed in at least 3 International events in Line and danced a full program- Dance A, Dance B, and Solo medley, in order to qualify for Worlds. This rule only applies after Dancers have carried their star status for 1 full year.

6. Basic Dance Rules For Dance A & B

A. All Star A&B dances will no longer allow any variations. Only full vanilla will be danced throughout.

7. Basic Dance Rules Solo Medley

A. Solo Medley (4 - 7 minutes, without BPM limitations): A category offered for Rising Stars, Megastars, Jewel and Regal which is a medley of dances choreographed to music of the competitors choice which must include a combined total of at least 45 seconds each of four of these Line Dance categories: Rise & Fall, Lilt, Smooth, Cuban, Funky and Novelty, that are each recognizable in pattern, accent, motion and character.

B. The star solo medley is to remain 50% country and 50% non country music.

C. Male star dancers are NOT required to wear a hat in their solo medley.

D. Boots MUST be worn in all dances.

- E. The star solo medleys will be judged the same as Teams with 3 criteria on the judges ballot sheets: technique/presentation/choreography.

8. Movement Limitations For Dance A & B

- A. A stationary dancing introduction is allowed within the radius of a single step during the music prior to the count-in.
- B. No acrobatics, bridging, lying or sitting on the floor (except for recovering from splits) are allowed.
- C. Pantomime, singing, or acted themes are not allowed.
- D. Jumps and jetés are allowed.

9. Movement Limitations For Solo Medley

- A. No movement limitations in the solo medley.

10. Music Dance A & B

- A. Music can be changed from the original, but will be the same rhythm.
- B. Dance length: 2 minutes approx.
- C. Each dance may be counted in.

11. Music Solo Medley

- A. Music length: 4 - 7 minutes.
- B. Solo Medley programs may use up to a combined total of 50% non Country Self Selected music.
- C. A resume of the medley must be turned in to the Music Director or the DJ at least 1 hour before the competition begins or risk being scratched.
- D. The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time requirement is last place.
- E. The CD should be labeled with your Name & Division.
- F. Brief recorded introductions and curtain calls are permitted.
- G. Clocking begins when either the performance or the performance sound begins, whichever comes first.
- H. Clocking ends when either the performance or the performance sound ends, whichever comes last (not including curtain calls).
- I. A Music resume is still required in all star divisions.
- J. A dance script is no longer required.

12. Costumes

- a. Every competitor must be a registered WCDF member before they compete. This division is for Novice competitors and above.

3. WorldCDF Championships requirements

- a. All competitors should have competed in at least 3 International Events with at least 1 competition in Renegade.

4. Basic Dance Rules

- a. Renegade is a spontaneous interpretation of the music in dance.

5. Movement Limitations

- a. Not allowed are acrobatics, aerials, lying, bridges and jetes which rotate.

6. Music

- a. Renegade Music will be previewed at the time that it will be danced. The Music will be played and then danced. This will make it easier for the judges to determine who is truly interpreting the music without a practiced routine.

1. Age Requirements

2. World Championships requirements

3. **Basic Dance Rules**

 - b. There are seven (7) competitive categories:

 - c. If an original dance is performed by other dancers the choreographer must physically be at the event.

 - i. The details which must be included on the step sheet can be found on the mock sheet in the General Rules.

 - c. Self selected music and a resume of the medley must be turned in to the music Director or the DJ at least 1 hour before their competition begins or risk being scratched.
 - d. The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time requirements is to be placed last.
 - e. The CD's should be labeled with Troupe name & Division.
 - f. Brief recorded introductions and curtain calls are permitted.

- g.** Clocking will start when either the performance or any performance sound begins, whichever comes first.
- h.** Clocking ends when either the performance or the performance sound ends, whichever comes last (excluding any curtain calls).

9. Costumes:

- a.** Costumes should be recognizable as a team/ troupe.
- b.** Team members must wear Cowboy boots or lace-up Ropers.
- c.** Costume must be country in appearance. It could help to have a yoke in the front or back, but is not necessary.
- d.** Cowboy Hats for men.
- e.** Hose and dance pants of any colour for ladies, junior youth and above, if they are exposed.
- f.** Advertisements on competition clothes are not allowed.
- g.** Glitter and sparkly attachments or materials are allowed.
- h.** Props are not allowed such as Face masks and weapons of any kind.
- i.** Limited theatrical makeup will be allowed.

Team Line, Partner, Cabaret (8 or more members)

1. Age Requirements:

- a. Open Age - all ages
- b. Junior - all members under 18
- c. Diamond - all members at least 40
- d. All teams in the same Dance Category are entered in the Open Age Group and compete against each other.
- e. In addition to this competition, if two or more of those teams are eligible for either the Junior Age Group or the Diamond Age Group, placements will also be awarded in the age group.

2. Overall Requirements

- a. For overall qualification Teams have to compete in the following Team categories:
 - i. Line
 - ii. Partner
 - iii. Cabaret

3. Entry Regulations:

- a. Every Team Captain must be a registered WCDF member before the Team competes.
- b. Each Team should have a Team name and may only dance once in any specific division at each event under this name.
- c. Every Team will be registered in the Team or troupe name.
- d. Teams competing in separate categories must have different music selections, and different dance routines.
- e. Any member of any team may dance in any Team category under any Team "Name".

4. WorldCDF Championships:

- a. Every Team will be registered in the Team name.
- b. Each Team name should have competed in at least 3 International events.
- c. All Team categories that will be dancing at the World Championships should have danced at least once at an international event in the year prior to the World Championships.

5. Basic Dance Rules:

- a. A Music resume is still required in all team divisions.
- b. A dance script is no longer required.
- c. **Line Dance:**
 - i. The program should be Line Dance; no Couples dances may be used.
- d. **Partner Dance:**
 - i. The program should be Partner and/ or Couple Dance; no Line Dance may be used.
- e. **Cabaret**
 - i. The program can be Line, Partner, and Couple in any combination.

6. Movement Limitations:

- a. Not allowed are acrobatics, aerials, lifts, lying, bridges, sits and jetes which rotate, except for Cabaret which has NO movement limitations.

7. Music

- a. Music length: 4 - 7 minutes.
- b. Line: self selected music up to 50% Non Country.
- c. Partner: self selected music up to 50% Non Country.

- d. Cabaret: self selected music, totally free in music choice.
- e. Self selected music and **a resume of the medley must be turned in** to the music Director or the DJ at least 1 hour before their competition begins or risk being scratched.
- f. The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time requirements is to **be placed last**.
- g. The CD's should be labeled with name/ Team name & Division.
- h. Brief recorded introductions and curtain calls are permitted.
- i. Clocking will start when either the performance or any performance sound begins, whichever comes first.
- j. Clocking ends when either the performance or the performance sound ends, which ever comes last (excluding any curtain calls).

8. Costumes:

- a. All costume rules below are not for Cabaret, except point vi.
- b. Setup and tear down may be no longer than 3 minutes each.
- c. Team members must wear:
 - i. Costumes should be recognizable as a team/ troupe.
 - ii. Cowboy boots or lace-up Ropers.
 - iii. Costume must be country in appearance. It could help to have a yoke in the front or back, but is not necessary.
 - iv. Cowboy Hats for men.
 - v. Hose and dance pants for the ladies, junior youth and above, if they are exposed.
 - vi. Advertisements on competition clothes are not allowed.
 - vii. Glitter and sparkly attachments or materials are allowed.
 - viii. Props are not allowed such as Face masks and weapons of any kind.
 - ix. Limited theatrical makeup will be allowed.

Showtime

1. Age Requirements:

- i. Open Age - all ages
- ii. Junior - all members under 18
- iii. Diamond - all members at least 40

All teams in the same Dance Category are entered in the Open Age Group and compete against each other. In addition to this competition, if two or more of those teams are eligible for either the Junior Age Group or the Diamond Age Group, placements will also be awarded in the age group.

2. Entry Regulations

- a. Every Team Captain Must be a registered WCDF member before the Team competes.
- b. Each Showtime-Team should have a name and may only dance once in any specific division at each event under this name.
- c. Each Showtime Team is only allowed to dance once at each International event.

3. WorldCDF Championships

- a. All Showtime Teams should have competed in at least 3 International events under the same name.

4. Basic Dance Rules:

- a. The program can be Solo, Line, Partner, and Couple in any combination.
- b. A Music resume is still required in all team divisions. A dance script is no longer required.

5. Movement Limitations:

- a. There are no movement limitations when performing a Showtime routine.

6. Music:

- a. Music length: 3 - 10 minutes.
- b. Self selected music, total free in music selection.
- c. Self selected music and a resume of the medley must be turned in to the music Director or the DJ at least 1 hour before their competition begins or risk being scratched.
- d. The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time requirements is to be placed last.
- e. The CD's should be labeled with Team name & Division.
- f. Brief recorded introductions and curtain calls are permitted.
- g. Clocking will start when either the performance or any performance sound begins, whichever comes first.
- h. Clocking ends when either the performance or the performance sound ends, which ever comes last (excluding any curtain calls)

7. Costumes:

- a. No costume requirements, except that to advertise on competition clothes is not allowed.
- b. Props are allowed. Setup and tear down may be no longer than 3 minutes each.

Social Team (4 or more members)

1. Age Requirements:

- i. Open Age - all ages
- ii. Junior - all members under 18
- iii. Diamond - all members at least 40

All teams in the same Dance Category are entered in the Open Age Group and compete against each other. In addition to this competition, if two or more of those teams are eligible for either the Junior Age Group or the Diamond Age Group, Placements will also be awarded in the age group.

2. Entry Regulations:

- a. Each Social Team should have a Troupe/ Team name and may only dance once in any specific division at each event under this name.
- b. Teams competing in separate categories must have different music selections, and different dance routines.
- c. Any member of any team may dance in any Social Team category under any Team "Name". WCDF Membership is not compulsory.

3. WorldCDF Championships

- a. This division does not qualify for the World Championships.

4. Basic Dance Rules:

- a. A dance or medley of dances choreographed to music of the Troupe or Team choice.
- b. It is an open category where Line, Solo and Couples dance may be used in any combination. Max. 50 % Partner or Couples into the choreography.
- c. A Music resume is still required in all team divisions.
- d. A dance script is no longer required.

5. Movement Limitations:

- a. Not allowed are acrobatics, aerials, Lifts, lying, bridges, sits, jumps and jetes which rotate.

6. Music:

- a. Music length: 4 - 7 minutes.
- b. Team programs may use up to a combined total 50% of non-Country music.
- c. Self selected music and **a resume of the medley must be turned in** to the music Director or the DJ at least 1 hour before their competition begins or risk being scratched.
- d. The Penalty for performances that do not meet the time **requirements is last place**.
- e. The CD's should be labeled with Team name & Division.
- f. Brief recorded introductions and curtain calls are permitted.
- g. Clocking will start when either the performance or any performance sound begins, whichever comes first.
- h. Clocking ends when either the performance or the performance sound ends, which ever comes last (excluding any curtain calls).

7. Costumes:

- a. No special costume requirements, safe footwear.
